A log based on the CDC's routine childhood schedule

Based on the CDC's routine childhood immunization schedule. Some vaccines combine into a single shot, and catch-up timing, extra doses, or a delayed schedule are all things your pediatrician may adjust for your baby, use this as a reference and log the actual dates they give you.

Birth	Hepatitis B (dose 1) and RSV antibody (nirsevimab), if not covered by a maternal RSV vaccine		
1 Month	Hepatitis B (dose 2)		
2 Months	DTaP (1), Hib (1), Pneumococcal (1), Polio/IPV (1), Rotavirus (1)		
4 Months	DTaP (2), Hib (2), Pneumococcal (2), Polio/IPV (2), Rotavirus (2)		
6 Months	Hepatitis B (3), DTaP (3), Pneumococcal (3), Polio/IPV (3), Flu (annual, from 6 months on)		
9 to 12 Months	MMR (1), Varicella (1)		
12 to 15 Months	Hib (final dose), Pneumococcal (4), DTaP (4), Hepatitis A (dose 1)		
15 to 18 Months	Hepatitis A (dose 2, 6 or more months after dose 1)
